Birmingham Workhouse---RARE paper notes. There are a very few of these impounded in museums, and **W. J. Davis**, who struck a copy Workhouse Sixpence, and catalogued the 19th C tokens in the late 1890's, managed to find a few of them. They are not known issued, all of the existing examples are unissued. They were made, according to Davis, in around 1808 (between the Conder series and the 19th C token issues) these notes were released by the Davis family. I was lucky enough to be "in the right place" in October and bought a partial set that had belonged to Davis. These notes each contain the name of the workhouse, and other information. They are dated 180--. **All so rare that most, including me, did not know they existed.** This is a great collectable, no hoards known, and a good opportunity for the Workhouse collector or note collector.

Obverse, Godfrey being strangled/Reverse, conjoined heads, if rotated **one way looks like the Pope, if the other way, it is a devil.** Part of the series of medals by Bower in reference to the protestant Catholic dispute in 1688. Medal silver, 1688, bit edgy, net VF, \$235.

Queen Victoria, Coronation 1838. Two paper medals, an “obverse and a reverse” Bust Victoria/Scene of her coronation, attendants at throne---in a metal and glass lunette, with hanger. The paper medals so contained are very rare in decent condition, this in the original lunette. Around 36mm, EF, purchased from a major medals dealer in London, this is the only one like it he has seen. Me, too!! \$285.

Queen Victoria---1887 Jubilee. Bust Victoria/Alegorical scene. 38mm Brown fibre, as new, superb \$65.

Toy Coins and Box--- Rogers 4200, by Lauer. This is a gilt on iron box, 33 X 73 mm, miniature vignette of a one pound note on the lid, and a hunting scene on the bottom of the box. Inside, eight toy coins, representing many denominations of British coinage, in superb condition. Set **RRR**, a real find, \$260.

Rowing Medal, 39mm silver, Kent, 1907. River scene, 5 man scull, rowers. Maidstone, 1907. GF \$75.

Captive Balloon medal, AE 44mm, Barcelona, Spain 1888. A Souvenir of Ascent, in the balloon “Espana”, at the Universal Expo, Barcelona. An edge bump, otherwise very nice. Net VF \$128.

Spencer’s Balloon---Souvenir of Ascent, London 1885-95 (not dated). Aluminium, 37mm, some marks but mostly bright, couple tone areas, **RARE**, and EF for wear, net VF for handling. \$145.

Blanchard’s Balloon---1st Flight over Germany, 1784. By Reich, **Silver**, 45mm, and **Very RARE.** Bust Blanchard,/Balloon over Berlin. With old ticket at £375, yours for \$675. VF+++ , very nice.

George III in oval, angel with shield watching over/Sun over crown, **“Preserved from assassination”.** May 15, 1800, an attempt was made on the King’s life. This 38mm AE medal is EF, some luster, just \$145.

Edward VIII, 35mm AE abdication medal, 1936. Bust Edward VIII/Ascended, Abdicated &c. UNC \$85

Queen Caroline---Return to Britain, 1820. WM 40mm, nearly 100% bright, Obv, Queen Caroline/Rev, Britannia on shore waving at ship. EF+, certainly one of the finest I have seen, \$65.

Queen Caroline---AE 31mm, (1821). Bust Caroline/Rev, QC, crown above. Net VF, **RARE** find, \$88
She was “crowned” as wife of George IV in 1821, and died same year under suspicious circumstances.

James Watt---silver medal, 44mm 1871. A first class award given to C. Mitchell for the model of a steamship. Mitchell was a builder of full sized ships!! Bust Watt/Royal Cornwall Polytech &c. GEF \$225.

The Two Princes---Prince George, born 1762, and Prince Frederick, born 1763 to George III and Charlotte. Bronze, 28mm, one prince on each side, as babies. **1763 issue,** Choice EF, luster!! superb!! \$135.

Queen Victoria—University of Edinburgh award, AE, 44 mm, 1859. Bust Victoria/ awarded for Chemistry, &c, the recipient, A. I. Spencer, named on the edge. **As new,** lovely luster, in the original box. \$155.

Edward VII, Coronation 1902. Silver Royal Mint medal, BHM 3737, 55mm. Bust Edward VII/ Bust Queen Alexandra. Luster, as made, no marks or problems, in the original mint box. Superb medal \$145.

George V, Coronation, 1911. Bronze, 50mm, Fully UNC, a matte look, in original perfect box. \$75.

Jacque Rousseau---AE, 36mm. Soho mint medal for Monneron, Paris, 1791. Lettered edge, GVF condition, an original, not a restrike. EF, \$59.
